



MCM 2 Crew 5 'Leading the Hunt'



2015 Overview

After an incredibly busy 2014 which included taking CHIDDINGFOLD out of refit as the first HUNT with the new Caterpillar diesel engines and delivering her to the Gulf, Crew 5 returned in Dec 14 for well deserved Christmas leave. A busy and rewarding 2015 ensued, firstly looking after LEDBURY in refit, then conducting UK tasking in HURWORTH preparing to deploy again.

LEDBURY to Ledbury Charity Triathlon Challenge (18-20 May)

In order to strengthen links with affiliates in Ledbury, Herefordshire, we invited them to Portsmouth to see their ship and then paid a reciprocal visit however as a military fighting force, we always like a challenge. Therefore we swam, cycled and ran the 220km over 3 days, and raised over £1,200 for two very worthy service charities. Everyone participated in some way so even if they were not cycling up hills, they were in support vehicles, or meeting locals and showing and explaining items of onboard equipment such as fire fighting hoses, diving sets and Seafox mine disposal system.



Defence Security Exhibition International (DSEI) at the ExCel Centre London

After a short notice period of national tasking, we sailed up the Thames to participate in DSEI representing the RN and supporting the First Sea Lord. Berthed at London's ExCel in Royal Victoria Docks, this was the largest naval participation ever at the event and all the 8 ships attracted huge crowds of visitors with particular interest in our MCM capabilities.



This was the first time a Minehunter had participated in the event and it proved to be a great success. We hosted over 500 guests including the Fleet Commander, Vice Admiral Sir Philip Jones KCB, Penny Mordaunt MP (Minister for Armed Forces) and members of the Armed Forces Parliamentary Scheme as well as military and industry delegations. We also hosted a dinner for members of the Merchant Taylors' Company (affiliated with 2nd MCM Squadron) who recently admitted the First Sea Lord and Sir Ben Ainslie as Honorary Freeman of the Company.

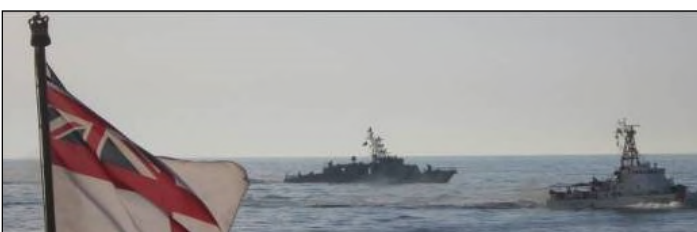
Sporting Challenges and Achievements
